

Woodsville High School Scholarship Directory

This scholarship directory has been created to help students and parents seek funds for undergraduate study. It lists scholarships with many different eligibility criteria that can be used for 2-year colleges, 4-year colleges, and vocational programs.

Listings will state the eligibility criteria, the application process, and a deadline if applicable. Many scholarship applications are on-line or do not arrive in the guidance office until the deadline approaches. Most are announced in school or on the guidance bulletin as they come in to the guidance office. Students are held responsible for seeking the application materials, and completing the application process before the deadline. Please note that for a number of local scholarships, students are not allowed to apply, but are selected by WHS faculty and community members based on the various merits that they have displayed throughout high school.

Achievement/Leadership Scholarships-

Elks: Most Valuable Student Scholarship-

This is a regional and national award. Students apply through the Littleton area Elks Club and may then be selected to compete on the national level. Number and amounts of awards vary from year to year.

Candidates are judged on **scholarship, leadership, community service, and financial need.**

Deadline- early December

George Coleman Scholarships-

The New England Association of College Registrars and Admissions Officers underwrites 3 scholarships for graduating high school **seniors from New England who show great promise to succeed in college.**

One scholarship is for study at a private institution; one is for a four-year program at a public college; and one is for a student attending a community college. The candidate must be recommended by the school guidance counselor and have at least a **3.0 GPA**. Find more information on-line at www.neacrao.org

Granite State Conference-

The Athletic Directors in the NHIAA Division IV award a scholarship to one **well-rounded scholar-athlete** from the conference who has participated in athletics, excelled in academics, and been actively involved in extracurricular activities and community service. Hamilton Award-

The highly selective Hamilton Award recognizes 35-40 high school juniors nationwide for their academic, personal and service achievements with a scholarship, assistance with college planning, and selection to attend the Hamilton Leaders Academy to train as a future global leader. This highly competitive scholarship selects up to 40 students nationwide per year based on exceptional academic ability and achievement, service to others, and leadership coupled with financial need to receive personal advising through the college and financial aid application process, as well as funding to assist with covering the cost of attendance through four years of undergraduate study. Janice M. Scott Memorial Scholarship-

Woodsville Area Booster Club-

Scholarship is awarded to a **well-rounded student/athlete** who plans to attend a post-secondary program, is active in extra-curricular activities, and accrues a minimum of **6 service points** for helping with Booster Club events. Students with accrued points are invited to apply.

St. Luke's Episcopal Church Scholarship for Leadership and Community Service-

This scholarship in the amount of \$250 is given to a college bound senior who is a member of JAG. It is good for any post-secondary institution (4 year, 2 year, trade, vocational, technical, etc.) The recipient is chosen by the WHS faculty and does not require an application.

Contests-

American Legion Oratorical Contest-

Students in **grades 9-12** are invited to write and then deliver an **8-10 minute oration** from memory that relates to a selected aspect of the U.S. Constitution. WHS then chooses one candidate to represent the school at a district competition. Winners may progress to the state and national competitions to win up to \$18,000.

American Legion Christa McAuliffe Scholarship-

One scholarship for a graduating **senior**, resident of NH for at least three years, with a "**B**" **average in both 11th and 12th grades**, accepted to a **four-year college** leading to a Bachelor's Degree in **education**. Delta Chapter of the Beta Alpha State Scholarship-

This is a local NH-based scholarship for **female** high school seniors who plan to enter the field of **education**. Application includes an essay and recommendations with special attention paid to personal qualities.

Haverhill Education Association Scholarship for Future Educators

This scholarship is for a **graduating senior** entering a program leading to a career in **education**. Applicants must submit an essay and a high school transcript. Money will be awarded at the beginning of the student's second semester in college provided the student maintains a 2.7 GPA.

New Hampshire Music Educators Association (NHMEA)-

Four scholarships are awarded to graduating **seniors** currently enrolled in a NH school who plan to pursue a career in **Music Education**. Information is available in Guidance or at <http://www.nhmea.org/36>

New Hampshire School Boards Association-

Competition for this scholarship is open to a public school student planning to pursue a career related to education who is the **child or grandchild of a current local school board member**.

NHTM Scholarship- This scholarship is awarded by the NH Teachers of Mathematics to a graduating high school **senior**. Candidates must be graduates of a NH high school or NH residents who have been accepted at a fully accredited college or university, and plan to major in **mathematics or math education**. Paul P. Tucker Memorial Scholarship-

This is a local scholarship for a four-year **college bound senior** who is planning a **career in education**. The successful candidate will demonstrate strong character. The principal will choose the winner. Students cannot apply.

WHS Teacher Scholarship-

Fine Arts Scholarships-

League of NH Craftsmen-

A scholarship offered to support a deserving graduating **senior** entering a college to study the arts in a **craft-related** discipline. Portfolio or review of the student's body of work is required.

Awards a scholarship to a deserving senior graduating from a local high school (including WHS) who while in school has shown proficiency in the arts (**art, dance, music and/or theater**) and has been accepted by the college of choice to continue with a major or minor in the arts. The Pine Hill Singers offer a \$500 music award to a graduating senior whose home residence is in northern NH or northern VT who has demonstrated **talent and proficiency in music** and will use the money to further his/her music development. Lakes Region Association of NH Hospitality Scholarship-

Scholarship is awarded to a NH resident accepted at an institution of higher learning to study a **tourism or hospitality-related field**.

This state-wide scholarship is awarded to a graduating **senior** planning to pursue a career in **food service**. Candidates can attend vocational school, two-year college, or four-year college. Activities, honors, community involvement, work experience, essay, and transcript will be considered.

Health/Medical Field Scholarships-

American Legion Raymond Conley Scholarship-

One scholarship for a resident of NH entering the first year of a 2 or 4 year program in **Physical or Mental Rehabilitation**. Application materials on-line at www.legionnh.org

American Legion Auxiliary Past President's Parley-

A scholarship for residents of NH who are interested in a career in **Nursing**, either as an RN or an LPN. Consideration will be given to: veteran status, grades, recommendations, financial need, and a short essay on career goals. Application on-line at www.legionnh.org

Dr. Elisabeth M. Berry Nursing Scholarship-

A competitive scholarship for graduates of **WHS**, Lisbon, Oxbow, BMU, and St. Johnsbury Academy that are accepted into an accredited school of **nursing** who demonstrate an aptitude for nursing plus financial need.

Deadline- May 1

Preston R. Clark, M.D. Scholarship-

Two awards are presented within NH to seniors at NHIAA member schools who are interested in **medicine, athletic training, nursing**, and/or the **care and treatment of sports injuries**. Candidates must have a GPA of 3.0 through their first semester of their senior year, be nominated by the school principal or athletic director, and submit a personal career statement.

National Health Service Corps-

Scholarships and loan repayment programs are available for students accepted to or enrolled in an accredited U.S. school in a primary care discipline such as: medicine (MD,DO), dentistry (DMD), nurse practitioner, certified midwifer, physician's assistant. Tylenol Scholarship-

Alice M. Yarnold and Samuel Yarnold Scholarship Trust-

This is for a NH student who is **already attending** a post-secondary institution in the fields of **nursing, medicine, or social work**. Candidates must demonstrate **financial need**. Applicants enrolled in fields other than those aforementioned may apply, but will not be given first consideration. Current high school seniors are NOT eligible until next year.

Military-Related Scholarships-

American Legion Auxiliary Adrienne Alix Scholarship-

For NH residents who are **reentering the workforce, displaced from the workforce, or recently honorably discharged from the military**. Candidates are required to write an essay and provide recommendations. Application on-line at www.legionnh.org

Deadline- May 1

American Legion Auxiliary Elsie Brown Scholarship-

This is a scholarship awarded to a **child or a grandchild of a deceased veteran** who is a resident of New Hampshire. Application considers recommendations, essay, grades, and need. Look on-line at www.legionnh.org

Deadline- Mid-April

American Legion Auxiliary Grace S. High Memorial Child Welfare Scholarship-

Two awards are given to **senior girls**, residents of NH, whose parent(s) have been continuous members of the American Legion or Auxiliary, or who are daughters of deceased veterans. Selection is based on financial need, character, scholarship, and Americanism. Go on-line to www.legionnh.org

Deadline- Mid-April

American Legion John A. High Child Welfare Scholarship-

Awarded to a **senior boy** whose parent(s) have been continuous members of the American Legion or Auxiliary, or who are the sons of deceased veterans. Selection is based on financial need, character, scholarship, and Americanism. Application on-line at www.legionnh.org

Deadline- Mid-April

American Legion Auxiliary Past President's Parley-

This is a scholarship for students who are interested in a career in **Nursing**, either as an RN or an LPN. Applicants must be residents of New Hampshire. Particular consideration will be given to **children of veterans**. Application on-line at www.legionnh.org

Deadline- May 1

American Legion Albert T. Marcoux Memorial Scholarship-

Candidate must have a **parent who is a current or deceased member of the American Legion or Auxiliary**. Awarded to one student state-wide who has at least a "B" average in grades 11 and 12, who has

been a resident of NH for at least three years, and shows acceptance into a four-year college. Find information at www.legionnh.org

Deadline- Mid-March

ROTC Scholarships-

These 2 or 4-year scholarships are competitive (based on academic performance, leadership potential, standardized test scores, and intended major), and cover the cost of tuition plus a stipend. Following college, students *must* commit to a term in the military. Candidates usually apply in the spring of their **junior** year in high school.

Deadline- Mid-November

Math/Science Scholarships-

National Kidney Foundation Awards-

The Science Summer Research Award- Five **seniors** of **under-represented minority** status will earn the opportunity to work as a paid intern in a laboratory during the summer months. This award is based on merit.

Deadline- Mid-February

NHTM Scholarship- This scholarship is awarded by the NH Teachers of Mathematics to a graduating high school **senior**. Candidates must be graduates of a NH high school or NH residents who have been accepted at a fully accredited college or university, and plan to major in **mathematics or math education**. Selection is based on academic achievement, financial need, extra-curricular involvement, and school & community involvement.

Deadline- Mid-February

New Hampshire Society of Professional Engineers-

Scholarships are offered to NH residents **pursuing undergraduate degrees in engineering** fields with preference given to students attending in-state institutions. Awards based on need, academic achievement, and community involvement. Application materials at www.nhspe.org/scholarships/

Deadline- April

New Hampshire Water Pollution Control Association Scholarship-

This is a scholarship for a N.H. resident who is high school **senior** planning to major in: **water pollution control, environmental science, engineering, or chemistry**. Find application at www.NHWPCA.org.

Catherine E. Newman Trust Scholarship-

Awarded to a graduating WHS **senior** who has excelled in and plans a college major in **science**. Students cannot apply for this award. The winner will be selected.

Ryegate Associates Annual Scholarship: GDF Suez Ryegate Power Station-

This local scholarship is awarded to a deserving high school **senior** who has been accepted at a **two or four-year** college. Students must demonstrate academic achievement, character, participation in extra-curricular activities, and financial need. Special consideration will be given to students considering majors in **engineering, forestry, or environmental science**. Application available through guidance.

SAE Engineering Scholarship Program-

A series of competitive national scholarships for high school **seniors** planning to earn a degree in **engineering** or a **related science**. Eligibility varies. See guidance or check on-line at www.sae.org

AIA/NH Architecture Scholarships-

The NH Section of the American Society of Civil Engineers awards a scholarship and possible summer internship to 4 HS seniors who plan to attend college to study **civil engineering**. Information and applications are on-line at: ascenh.org

American Legion: Vocational Education Scholarship-

Offered to a student who has been a NH resident for at least three years and who will be entering the first year of an accredited college working toward an **Associates Degree**. Candidates must have at least a "B" average in grades 11 and 12, submit a resume, transcript, and recommendations. Visit www.nhlegion.org for scholarship information.

Career Aid for Technical Students

Scholarships for **NH residents pursuing vocational or technical training** are administered by the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation and available on-line starting February 1 at www.nhcf.org.

Deadlines- varied

Dean Memorial Aviation Scholarship-

This scholarship is earmarked for a senior who is going on for education or training in an **aviation-related field**. The student must be a resident of or a graduate from a high school in one of the following towns: Haverhill, NH (WHS); Corinth, Craftsbury or St. Johnsbury, VT. Award is based on an essay, scholastic achievement, and/or financial need. Applications are available in the guidance office.

Grafton County Farm Bureau Scholarship-

A scholarship awarded to students planning to attend a 2 or 4-year college to pursue a degree in **agriculture or a related field**, such as: horticulture, ag. engineering, wildlife, veterinary medicine, soil science, etc. Applications are available in the guidance office.

Deadline- Early May

Haverhill Cooperative Student Trust Scholarship-

Awards will be given to **graduates of WHS** who enter **vocational schools**. Students are asked to write a letter indicating the college they plan to attend, course of study, and reasons for consideration.

Applications are available in the guidance office.

Deadline- Mid-May

Leslie Lackie Memorial Award-

This local award will be given to a **senior** who is planning to attend a 2-year, vocational, or technical program within **mechanical technology**. Students are selected locally, they cannot apply for this award

The Lavoie Family Vocational-Technical Scholarship-

This scholarship is for a **WHS graduate** who plans to attend a **two-year vocational college**. The candidate **cannot use alcohol, tobacco products, or drugs**. Students must submit a letter indicating the school they plan to attend, course of study, and a personal history. Applications are available in the guidance office.

Deadline- Late May

The Medallion Fund-

For residents of NH who have the drive to **pursue a short-term vocational/technical career that does not merit a four year degree (auto tech, CDL, LNA, etc)**. Applications are accepted at any time through the NH Charitable Foundation and are available at www.nhcf.org.

New Hampshire Land Surveyors: Moran Family Scholarship

Sponsored by the NH Land Surveyors Foundation, this scholarship is offered to graduating NH high school seniors with financial need who will be pursuing a **career in surveying or a related field** such as civil engineering. White Mountains CC-Berlin Scholarship-

Scholarships, dispersed over two years, will be awarded to graduating **seniors** from several northern NH high schools who plan to matriculate **full-time** in degree programs at White Mountains Community College-Berlin. Must maintain a 3.0 GPA to continue to receive the award. Application is available in the guidance office.

Deadline- April 15

White Mountains Community College: Automotive Scholarship-

Awards sponsored by AAA will be given to graduating NH **seniors** accepted into the **automotive** program at Berlin for the following fall.

NH Community College System Valedictorian Scholarship-

This scholarship covers the cost of two years of tuition and fees (not room and board) for **valedictorians** graduating from NH high schools who have been accepted by and plan to attend one of the NH Community Colleges.

Deadline- June/July

NHAEF Automotive Technology Scholarship-

The New Hampshire Automotive Education Foundation and New Hampshire Automobile Dealers Association (NHADA) are offering scholarships to **seniors** pursuing a career in **automotive technology, collision repair or mobile equipment technology** within the New Hampshire Community College system. NH Water Pollution Control Association Student Scholarship-
