

Woodsville High School Scholarship Directory

This scholarship directory has been created to help students and parents seek funds for undergraduate study. It lists scholarships with many different eligibility criteria that can be used for 2-year colleges, 4-year colleges, and vocational programs.

Listings will state the eligibility criteria, the application process, and a deadline if applicable. Many scholarship applications are on-line or do not arrive in the guidance office until the deadline approaches. Most are announced in school or on the guidance bulletin as they come in to the guidance office. Students are held responsible for seeking the application materials, and completing the application process before the deadline. Please note that for a number of local scholarships, students are not allowed to apply, but are selected by WHS faculty and community members based on the various merits that they have displayed throughout high school.

Achievement/Leadership Scholarships-

Elks: Most Valuable Student Scholarship-

This is a regional and national award. Students apply through the Littleton area Elks Club for local monies and may then be selected to compete on the national level. Number and amounts of awards vary from year to year. Candidates are judged on **scholarship, leadership, community service, and financial need.**

Deadline- February 2nd

Robert C. Byrd Honors Scholarship-

Achieving high school seniors who show promise of continued academic success in college are eligible to apply for a renewable annual scholarship. Academic success can be interpreted through grades, art or musical performance, vocational education, etc.

Deadline- First Friday in April

George Coleman Scholarships-

The New England Association of College Registrars underwrites 3 scholarships for graduating high school **seniors from New England who show great promise to succeed in college.** One scholarship is for study at a private institution; one is for a four-year program at a public college; and one is for a student attending a community college. Granite State Conference-

The Athletic Directors in the NHIAA Division IV award a scholarship to one **well-rounded scholar-athlete** from the conference who has participated in athletics, excelled in academics, and been actively involved in extracurricular activities and community service. LEAP: Bank of New Hampshire Scholarship Program-

Each year nine deserving students from the state of New Hampshire are awarded a monetary scholarship and the opportunity to complete a paid summer internship at a branch of the Bank of New Hampshire. Stephen Phillips Memorial Scholarship-

Residents of New England can apply for this 4-year renewable scholarship that is awarded to worthy students who demonstrate **financial need, academic excellence, service, good character, and a strong work ethic.** Apply on-line at www.phillips-scholarship.org

The Principal's Leadership Award-

This is a competitive, national level merit-based scholarship. WHS can nominate one senior who ranks in the **top 20%** of the class and has demonstrated **exemplary leadership** during high school.

Deadline- Mid-November

Woodsville-Wells River Rotary Club Scholarship-

This local scholarship is awarded to a **senior** in the **top 1/3** of the class based on achievement, extra-curricular activities and financial need. Can be used for two or four year institutions.

Deadline- Late April

Business Scholarships-

Stephen Bufton Memorial Educational Fund-

National scholarships are awarded each year in the amounts of \$5,000 to \$10,000. All national scholarships have their requirements designated by the SBMEF Board of Trustees. The national scholarships are open to women meeting the requirements of each national scholarship listed below. Ten grants are awarded annually to graduating **seniors** who have been **residents of NH** for two consecutive years and plan to attend a structured post-secondary program within one year after high school. The award is not based on financial need or GPA, but earmarked for those students who best exemplify **volunteerism, independence, and leadership potential**. Orford Lion's Club Scholarship-

Candidates must be graduating **seniors** from **Piermont, Orford, Lyme, or Fairlee** who have excelled both academically and personally, and who have acted in ways that have **benefited their community**. The one-year award can be used toward the costs of any "reasonable" post-secondary education, including trade school.

Deadline- Late April

President's Student Service Challenge Scholarships-

High school **juniors and seniors** who have donated at least **100 hours of community service** within the last 12 months are eligible. Candidates must be U.S. Citizens or permanent residents. WHS can nominate two students for this award. The award involves seeking matching funds.

Deadline- Early May

Prudential Spirit of Community Award-

WHS can nominate one student from **any grade level** to be recognized for an **outstanding community service project**. School winners will receive a certificate and an opportunity to compete for a state-wide prize. State winners will also receive an all-expense paid trip to Washington, D.C. and the opportunity to compete for a national prize

Janice M. Scott Memorial Scholarship-

In honor of one of the victims of the 9/11 attack on the Pentagon, six scholarships will be awarded to HS seniors who show: **1) financial need; 2) academic strength; 3) community service; 4) writing skill**.

These are national scholarships for well-rounded, civic-minded **seniors** with a record of strong **community service**. Apply by filling out a short application (found at Target stores) or on the Target Web site at www.target.com. You can also call 1-800-316-6142.

Woodsville Area Booster Club-

Scholarship is awarded to a **well-rounded student/athlete** who plans to attend a post-secondary program, is active in extra-curricular activities, and accrues a minimum of **6 service points** for helping with Booster Club events.

American Legion Oratorical Contest-

Students in **grades 9-12** are invited to write and then deliver an **8-10 minute oration** from memory that relates to a selected aspect of the U.S. Constitution. WHS then chooses one candidate to represent the school at a district competition. Winners may progress to the state and national competitions to win up to \$18,000.

Manning & Zimmerman 7th Amendment Scholarships-

\$1,000 scholarship awarded to two New Hampshire high school students who plan to pursue any type of secondary education or vocational/technical school (in-state or out-of-state). A scholarship awarded to a graduating **senior** from NH who plans to attend a **four-year** accredited college with an intended major in the **Arts, Architecture or Interior Design**. Dr. Elisabeth M. Berry Nursing Scholarship-

Graduates of **WHS**, Lisbon, Oxbow, BMU, and St. Johnsbury Academy are eligible to compete for this local scholarship that seeks students accepted into an accredited school of **nursing** who demonstrate an aptitude for nursing plus financial need. The recipient *must* agree to work at **Cottage Hospital** for one year for every year of scholarship support or repay the award.

Two awards are presented within NH to seniors at NHIAA member schools who are interested in **medicine, athletic training, nursing**, and/or the **care and treatment of sports injuries**. Candidates must have a GPA of 3.0 through their first semester of their senior year, be nominated by the school principal or athletic director, and submit a personal career statement.

Conway Memorial Scholarship-

This scholarship will be awarded to a graduating **senior**, planning to attend a 2-year or 4-year college. The successful candidate will be selected by the principal, and must be planning a career in the **medical field**.

Golub Foundation: Two Year Health Care Scholarship-

Awarded to a student in the Price Chopper marketing area who has demonstrated scholastic ability and is starting the first year of a two-year community or junior college program in a **health-care field**. NH Clinical Laboratory Alliance Funding Program-

Eleven hospitals in NH fund a **full-tuition scholarship** for students to attend the **Clinical Laboratory Technician** program at River Valley Community College in Claremont in exchange for a commitment to work for at least two years in one of the hospitals in the consortium. Alice M. Yarnold and Samuel Yarnold Scholarship Trust-

This is for a NH student who is **already attending** a post-secondary institution in the fields of **nursing, medicine, or social work**. Candidates must demonstrate **financial need**. Applicants enrolled in fields other than those aforementioned may apply, but will not be given first consideration. Current high school seniors are NOT eligible until next year.

Military-Related Scholarships-

American Legion John A. High Child Welfare Scholarship-

Awarded to a **senior boy** whose parent(s) have been continuous members of the American Legion or Auxiliary, or who are the sons of deceased veterans. Selection is based on financial need, character, scholarship, and Americanism. Application on-line at

American Legion Albert T. Marcoux Memorial Scholarship-

Candidate must have a **parent who is a current or deceased member of the American Legion or Auxiliary**. Awarded to one student state-wide who has at least a "B" average in grades 11 and 12, who has been a resident of NH for at least three years, and shows acceptance into a four-year college. Military Children Scholarship Program

Children under the age of 23 of active duty/reserve/guard personnel and retired military members or survivors of service members who died while on active duty. Applicants must be enrolled or planning to enroll in a full-time undergraduate program of studied leading to a Bachelor's Degree at an accredited U.S. college or university. The Citadel: Joseph D. Aiken Scholarship Fund-

Covers the full cost of the first three years of study for qualified **New England residents admitted to The Citadel**, a co-ed, four-year, military college in South Carolina. The application is part of the admission process.

ROTC Scholarships-

These 2 or 4-year scholarships are competitive (based on academic performance, leadership potential, standardized test scores, and intended major), and cover the cost of tuition plus a stipend. Following college, students *must* commit to a term in the military. Candidates usually apply in the spring of their **junior** year in high school.

Math/Science Scholarships-

NHTM Scholarship- This scholarship is awarded by the NH Teachers of Mathematics to a graduating high school **senior**. Candidates must be graduates of a NH high school or NH residents who have been accepted at a fully accredited college or university, and plan to major in **mathematics or math education**. Selection is based on academic achievement, financial need, extra-curricular involvement, and school & community involvement.

Deadline- May 1

New Hampshire Society of Professional Engineers-

Scholarships are offered to NH residents **pursuing undergraduate degrees in engineering** fields with preference given to students attending in-state institutions. Deadline- April 30

New Hampshire Water Pollution Control Association Scholarship-

This is a scholarship for a N.H. resident who is high school **senior** planning to major in: **water pollution control, environmental science, engineering, or chemistry**. Find application at www.NHWPCA.org.

Catherine E. Newman Trust Scholarship-

Awarded to a graduating WHS **senior** who has excelled in and plans a college major in **science**. Students cannot apply for this award. The winner will be selected.

Ryegate Associates Annual Scholarship: Tractebel, Ryegate Power Station-

This local scholarship is awarded to a deserving high school **senior** who has been accepted at a **two** or **four-year** college. Students must demonstrate academic achievement, character, participation in extra-curricular activities, and financial need. Special consideration will be given to students considering majors in **engineering, forestry, or environmental science**.

SAE Engineering Scholarship Program-

AIA/NH Architecture Scholarships-

This scholarship is earmarked for a senior who is going on for education or training in an **aviation-related field**. Award is based on an essay, scholastic achievement, and/or financial need.

Golub Foundation: Two Year Scholarship-
